ITINERARY

Day 1 - Departing early this morning from Camp Hill, you'll head west making a second pick up in Monroeville. From there you will travel to Akron, OH to visit the Stan Hywet Hall and Gardens. Built between 1912 and 1915 for F. A. Seiberling (Founder of Goodyear Tire & Rubber), Stan Hywet hall is one of the finest examples of the American Country Estate movement and the 6th largest historic house in the U.S. open to the public. The Manor House is filled with treasures from around the globe; every room tells its own story



of the Seiberlings' lifestyle – from the Billiard Room where Mr. Seiberling entertained business associates, to the ornate Music Room where famous celebrities entertained the Seiberlings and friends. Following your visit to Stan Hywet Hall and Gardens you will travel to Toledo, OH and check into the Comfort Inn and Suites. Dinner is included at a local restaurant this evening. (DINNER)



Day 2 - After breakfast at the hotel and check-out, you will travel to Dearborn, MI. A rest stop will be made en route. Arriving in Dearborn, you'll visit The Henry Ford Museum and Greenfield Village. This amazing complex commemorates 300 years of the American experience. National treasures on display here include the Rosa Parks bus, presidential limousines, and a folding camp bed used by George Washington.

Greenfield Village includes eight historic districts, vintage transportation, skilled artisans and costumed presenters. Lunch and dinner are on your own today. Late this afternoon, check into the Doubletree by Hilton Detroit/Dearborn hotel. Relax and enjoy the amenities of this full

service hotel. (BREAKFAST)

Day 3 - After breakfast this morning and checkout, you'll travel north to Mackinaw City and board a ferry to Mackinac Island. A horse-drawn carriage will meet you at the dock and transfer everyone to The Grand Hotel. Following check-in, feel free to stroll the gardens, relax on the 660-foot front porch, take a swim in the magnificent serpentine pool or browse the charming shops in the nearby 19th century village. Lunch is on your own today. A five course dinner is included this evening in the Main Dining Room of the Grand Hotel. Gentlemen are required to wear a coat and tie and ladies are asked to wear a dress or dressy pantsuit. Following dinner, join the other guests in the parlor for nightly demitasse and music performed by the Grand Hotel Orchestra. (BREAKFAST, DINNER)



Day 4 - A full American Breakfast is included this morning in the Main Dining Room of the hotel. Following breakfast, hop aboard a Mackinac Island Carriage for a narrated tour of the island and the major points of interest. Lunch is on your own today. This afternoon is free for you to enjoy the amenities of the hotel, or browse the many unique galleries and shops in the village. A five course dinner is included again this evening in the Main Dining Room (dress code observed as outlined above). Demitasse and music

are available in the parlor following dinner. (BREAKFAST, DINNER)

Day 5 – A full American Breakfast is included this morning in the Main Dining Room. Following breakfast and checkout, you'll take the ferry back to the mainland and your waiting motorcoach. Once everyone is aboard, you'll head south to the town of Frankenmuth with a lunch stop (on your own) along the way. Arriving in Frankenmuth this afternoon, visit Bronner's Christmas Wonderland, the world's largest Christmas store. Following your visit you will travel to Toledo, OH and check into the Comfort Inn and Suites. Dinner is included this evening at a local restaurant. (BREAKFAST, DINNER)





Day 6 - Following breakfast at the hotel and check out, you'll travel to Cleveland, OH for a visit to the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame. Learn about some of the many highlights of the Rock Hall's permanent collection of rock & roll treasures and view some of the special exhibits on display for a limited time. Lunch is on your own here in the Rock Hall Café. Following your visit to the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame you will head for home

with fond memories of your Mackinac Island vacation. (BREAKFAST).
